Perinatal Bereavement

Details

This course aims to educate healthcare providers on how to support the grief process of families experiencing perinatal or newborn loss, while addressing the emotional needs of caregivers. It focuses on providing resources for individualized care, promoting compassion, and preventing caregiver burnout through education and self-care strategies, ensuring both families and caregivers receive the support they need during this difficult time.
